## Attachment A

On November 15, 2013, Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Special Agents received information from a source of information regarding the alleged purchase of five (5) AK-47 assault rifles by Salatiel DURAN REYES who was anticipating smuggling the assault rifles from the U.S. to Mexico. The source of information stated DURAN REYES was planning on purchasing the weapons in the parking lot at the San Juan Basilica in San Juan, Texas. The source of information stated DURAN REYES was arranging a meeting with an undocumented alien (UDA) to arrange for the smuggle of the assault rifles. The source of information stated DURAN REYES would be driving a maroon Chevrolet truck.

On the same date, HSI and ATF Special Agents maintained continued and constant surveillance of the San Juan Basilica parking lot. Subsequently, Special Agents observed a Maroon Chevrolet park adjacent to a black Mustang and observed a male subject open the trunk of the mustang. The male subject reentered his truck where it appeared he was adjusting the maroon truck in a position to load something from the mustang to his truck. Special Agents approached and arrested male subject later identified as DURAN REYES, a lawful permanent resident from Mexico residing in the U.S. Special Agents looked into the trunk of the mustang where 5 boxes containing AK-47s were discovered.

Following the immediate arrest of DURAN REYES, a search of the glove compartment of the maroon truck resulted in the discovery \$4540 in U.S. currency. Without questioning and immediately following his arrest, DURAN REYES blurted out he was purchasing the weapons for the sole purpose of unlawfully exporting them from the U.S. to Mexico. DURAN REYES stated the weapons were going to be smuggled possibly utilizing a green Chevrolet Avalanche and hidden in a compartment located in the rear seats and through one of the Ports of Entry in Hidalgo County, Texas.

DURAN REYES was arrested for violation of Title 22, U.S.C. 2778, Control of Arm Exports and Imports.
